Willow Class Newsletter

The Reception Willows have been learning all about Plants by sharing the text 'Enrol's Garden.' We have loved comparing seeds and getting messy in the mud kitchen. We have also been exploring 3D shapes and how to create repeating patterns in Maths. This next we have just started to look at grouping and doubling. The reception children are learning to build.

As part of our structured storytime sessions we have been sharing the text 'Stand up to Racism'. The book focuses on celebrating differences and learning how to stand up against discrimination. We have been having some great discussions about this topic. We have also studied 'Clean up' which was all about the environment.

In our writing topic we have been Year 1 and 2 have been learning what makes a simple narrative by sharing the story 'The Princess and the frog.' The children have been looking for expanded noun phrases within the text and having a go at writing their own. We have been planning out the story ready to retell it.



Year 1 and 2, have just finished reading 'Fantastically Great Women Who Changed the World' focusing on retrieval and inference. They will be starting 'Fantastic Mr Fox' next week.

In science we have recapped our learning on properties of materials through exploration. In maths this term, the topic has been on fractions focusing on learning that a fraction is a part of a whole and must always be divided into equal parts. In DT we have been learning about how strong paper actually is, and how paper can be folded in order to create structures. We had a great time testing how many books one piece of paper can hold! (The answer was 9!).
